PARTIAL SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT

This Partial Settlement Agreement (the Agreement) is entered into by and between the United States Department of Transportation, Office of the Secretary (OST), Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA), Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration (PHMSA), National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), and Federal Transit Administration (FTA) (referred to jointly as the Agency) and the American Federation of Government Employees Local 3313 (the Union) (collectively, the Parties).

On or about July 30, 2014, the Union filed Grievances against the Agency, which included allegations of Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA) violations, on behalf of all bargaining unit employees (BUEs) encumbering any bargaining unit position, going back three (3) years prior to the filing of the Grievances up until the resolution of the Grievances and including all employees ever in the Bargaining Unit at any point during the pendency of the Grievances. The five Grievances filed by the Union are collectively referred to herein as the "Grievances."

Since the filing of the Grievances, the Parties have engaged in settlement negotiations for the purpose of reaching a resolution of this matter and now freely and voluntarily enter into this Agreement in an effort to resolve fully and completely the issue of FLSA designations of employees in the Agency Bargaining Units covered by the Grievances. This Agreement addresses bargaining unit positions, grades and series for which the Union has challenged the Agency designation of FLSA Exempt during the covered timeframes of the Grievances. This Agreement in no way constitutes an admission by either Party that it has violated any statute, regulation or the Parties' collective bargaining agreements, and it is entered solely for the purpose of settling the specific issues stated herein.

By affixing their signature hereto, the Union and Agency each acknowledge their complete understanding and acceptance of all the recitals and of all of the provisions of this Agreement.

1. COVERAGE

This Agreement covers the following Agency employees in the AFGE Local 3313 Bargaining Units listed below:

- 1) OST
 - a. Non-Professional Bargaining Unit 1133.
 - b. Professional Bargaining Unit 1137: The Parties agree that OST's Professional Bargaining Unit 1137 was not encompassed within the Grievance filed by the Union against OST on or about July 30, 2014, but agree that in lieu of the Union's filing of a new grievance for the Professional Bargaining Unit employees, they will join the Grievances as of the date of full execution of this Agreement. The Parties agree that all timeframes applicable to the OST Professional Bargaining Unit will be based on this date of execution being used as the 'filing' date.
- FMCSA —Bargaining Unit 3675: All professional and non-professional headquarters employees of FMCSA.
- 3) PHMSA Bargaining Unit 5901.
- NHTSA- Bargaining Unit 2766.
- FTA- Non-Professional Bargaining Unit 2688 and Professional Bargaining Unit 2694.

It is the intent of the Parties to address the FLSA exemption status of all BUEs in all graded positions ever designated by the Agency as FLSA Exempt during the Grievances timeframes. While the Parties believe this Agreement accomplishes that goal, should the Union become aware of any Agency graded positions existing during the Grievance timeframes which are not addressed on an Attachment, it will bring the omissions to the attention of the Agency and the Parties agree to promptly address resolution of the same in good faith.

The Parties agree that the applicable timeframes for damages covered by the Grievances have not been resolved and will be addressed separately from this Agreement. This Agreement intends to resolve the FLSA exemption status for any and all applicable timeframes for damages covered by the Grievances.

2. TREATMENT OF CURRENT AND PAST INCUMBENTS AS NON-EXEMPTATTACHMENT A

For the purpose of calculation of any and all damages alleged by the Grievances, the Parties agree to treat as FLSA Non-Exempt all BUEs who currently encumber and/or previously encumbered any of the positions in the series and grades identified as Non-Exempt in Attachment A for the period of time they encumbered these positions during the timeframes covered by the Grievances, except as listed in Attachment B. Formal personnel actions affecting FLSA designations of BUEs who no longer encumber any of the graded positions in Attachment A will not be made by the Agency in the Agency's system of records.

3. RE-DESIGNATION AS NON-EXEMPT – ATTACHMENT A

The Parties agree that the Agency will change the FLSA designations from Exempt to Non-Exempt for BUEs who currently hold Bargaining Unit positions in the series and grades identified as Non-Exempt in Appendix A to this Agreement, except as listed in Attachment B, to the extent they are not already designated as Non-Exempt. Personnel actions documenting the designation changes will be issued within ninety (90) calendar days of the effective date of this Agreement. The Agency agrees to provide the Union with a report that lists the updated FLSA designations of the AFGE BUEs encumbering the positions in the series and grades listed in Attachment A within thirty (30) calendar days of the conclusion of this re-designation period.

4. CONTINUATION AS EXEMPT—ATTACHMENT A & B

For the purpose of calculation of any and all damages alleged by the Grievances, the Parties agree to treat as FLSA Exempt all BUEs designated as FLSA Exempt while encumbering and/or previously encumbering any of the positions in the series and grades identified as FLSA Exempt in Attachments A and B for the period of time they encumbered these positions during the timeframes covered by the Grievances.

5. DAMAGES, ATTORNEY FEES

This Agreement does not address damages for any BUEs covered under the Grievances, though it does address the FLSA Exemption component, which is a factor relevant to the calculation of damages. The Parties agree that the issues of damages, costs and attorney fees have not yet been resolved and will be addressed by the Parties separate from this Agreement.

6. JURISDICTION OVER NONCOMPLIANCE

In the event that a dispute arises regarding the terms of this Agreement or over the implementation of this Agreement, the Parties agree to attempt to mutually resolve the dispute. The Party alleging a dispute shall notify the other Party in writing within thirty (30) calendar days from the date the issue giving rise to the dispute is known, or should reasonably have been known, to the raising Party. If the Parties are unable to mutually resolve the dispute within sixty (60) calendar days from the date of the notification, the Parties agree to submit the dispute for Arbitration in accordance with the respective collective bargaining agreements between the Parties, except if an Arbitrator has already been selected to address the damages portion of the Grievances, the Parties agree to submit the dispute to that Arbitrator. The Parties may extend the time period with which to submit the dispute to arbitration upon written agreement.

7. NON-PRECEDENTIAL NATURE OF AGREEMENT

This Agreement is entered into for the purpose of settling the matters stated herein and may not be introduced as evidence by either Party in any type of litigation, proceeding or dispute other than the Grievances and/or to enforce the terms of this Agreement. Accordingly, this Agreement shall not be cited as precedent in any other grievances, arbitration or litigation between the Parties. It shall not bind the Parties in any proceedings, judicial or administrative in nature, except as necessary to effectuate the terms of this Agreement.

8. FUTURE FLSA ACTIONS

The Parties agree that in the future the Agency may designate or re-designate current or future BUEs/Bargaining Unit positions as Exempt or Non-Exempt in accordance with applicable statutes and regulations.

9. INDEPENDENT AGREEMENT

The Parties agree that this Partial Settlement Agreement is an independent Agreement. The failure of the Parties to amicably resolve the remainder of claims under the Grievances shall not invalidate this Agreement, and in the event of arbitration of any claim under the Grievances, this Agreement will be controlling as to the FLSA designations agreed to herein.

10. INCORPORATION

This Agreement sets forth the entire agreement between the Parties regarding the FLSA Exemption status component of the Grievances and fully supersedes any and all prior agreements or understanding between them.

11. AMENDMENTS OR MODIFICATIONS

This **Agreement** is a binding and enforceable settlement contract and no Party may modify it at a later date without execution of a separate written agreement between the Parties.

12. Authority

The Parties stipulate that the signatories to this Agreement have the full authority to enter into this Agreement and to make the agreements, obligations and considerations contained herein.

13. SIGNATURES

For the purposes of this Agreement, a facsimile or photocopy of signature(s) shall be considered to be an original signature. Signatures may be on successive pages and attached to the Agreement.

14. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Agreement shall be effective on the date all signatories have signed this Agreement.
